





Emma Clevenger

A few months ago, we were contacted by Shannon Andrus of *Hearts for the Arts* studio about a talented young woman who attended one of her Art Workshops. Shannon told us that the young woman makes beautiful portable mats for the homeless so they don't have to sleep on the ground. Naturally, we had to find out more!

After making a few contacts, we learned that this talented young lady is Emma Clevenger. Emma's mother, Tonya Clevenger, sent us several photos and explained the process that Emma goes through to create these beautiful mats: The bigger mats are knitted with wooden dowels that Emma has crafted into huge knitting needles. The smaller mats are crocheted. Both are made from plastic grocery bags.

Emma makes her mats at the Kroc Center in Grand Rapids. She goes there almost every day to hang out and knit, sometimes for hours at a time. Kroc members and employees have gotten to know Emma and bring in bags for her to knit (one member contacted Meijer and secured donated bags as well).

Last year, after Emma finished her first mat, she asked Kroc Program Supervisor Jessica Pollins to help her deliver the project to a local shelter. "It feels good," said Emma. "I feel like I have a purpose in this world."
